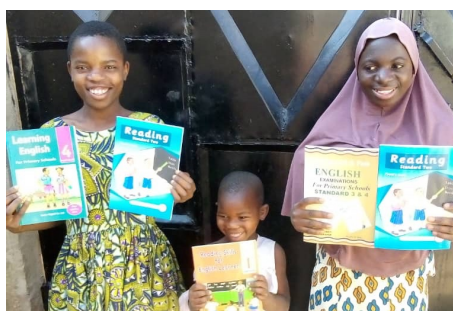

Selemani, above, a profoundly deaf young man, gets his certificate in Security Installation from his tutor.

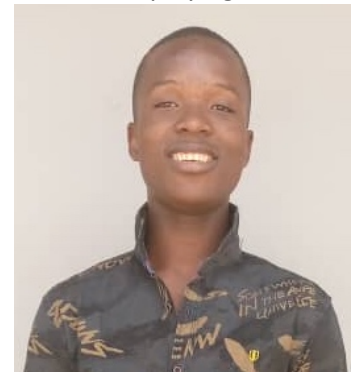


Kagoli, above, has qualified after 3 years of training in Nursing and Midwifery.
