It's not just that this little lass was hungry and vulnerable but her 6 year old sister had to stay home to look after her so wasn't able to come to the TLC Centre or go to school. Now all is well, and little sister has a lovely sponsor and is our newest recruit. Watch this space for a smiley picture soon.

A mail bag full of cards and letters for the children from sponsors has just landed in Tabora with UK Trustee, Dave. Every child will receive one and thanks to everyone who sent one.

Our sponsors are the very best! One of those, visiting Tabora recently, wrote this: 'We had a wonderful time - such a warm welcome! I was very impressed how much has happened in TLC since my visit 4 years ago. The children are so happy and the staff are so caring and kind. Everything is so well organised with really kind and competent staff. You are all doing such wonderful work and I just wanted to tell you what a difference you all are making.'



On the subject of **Christmas**, the staff have made a budget for a special Christmas get together with chip omlettes and a bottle of pop for 147, a small present for 95 of the younger children, and a parcel of food (10 kg rice, 5kg beans) for each of 104 families (we have more than one child from some families). <u>Total cost £1290</u>, total <u>Christmas fund raised so far £553</u>. 
Seven TLC Children graduated from Standard 7 (end of primary school)

Crissy, an educator herself, living far away from Tabora, had selected and bought the books while on a trip to Dar es Salaam and Brenden collected them and then brought them to Tabora for the children to read. Extra lessons are being provided by two of the lecturers from the local teachers training college, to try and engender a love of reading in the children. These books will provide a huge boost to that project.

This year's results for the end of primary school national exams were so good for all the TLC children at government schools, where they share one teacher with at least 100 other children. Hopefully TLC is on the right track with its extra lessons after school and this special literacy programme.

This lad became **suddently ill**, cause unknown. He was taken to the dispensary but they were unable to treat him there. TLC staff then took him to hopsital where he underwent several tests, all negative. He was very weak and sick and had to be hand fed with milk only. Eventually he was treated for

typhoid and slowly began to get better. He has now been discharged from hospital and is home again. See right. We are so grateful for the immediate excellent care that TLC staff gave him and that they give to all of the children every day.
